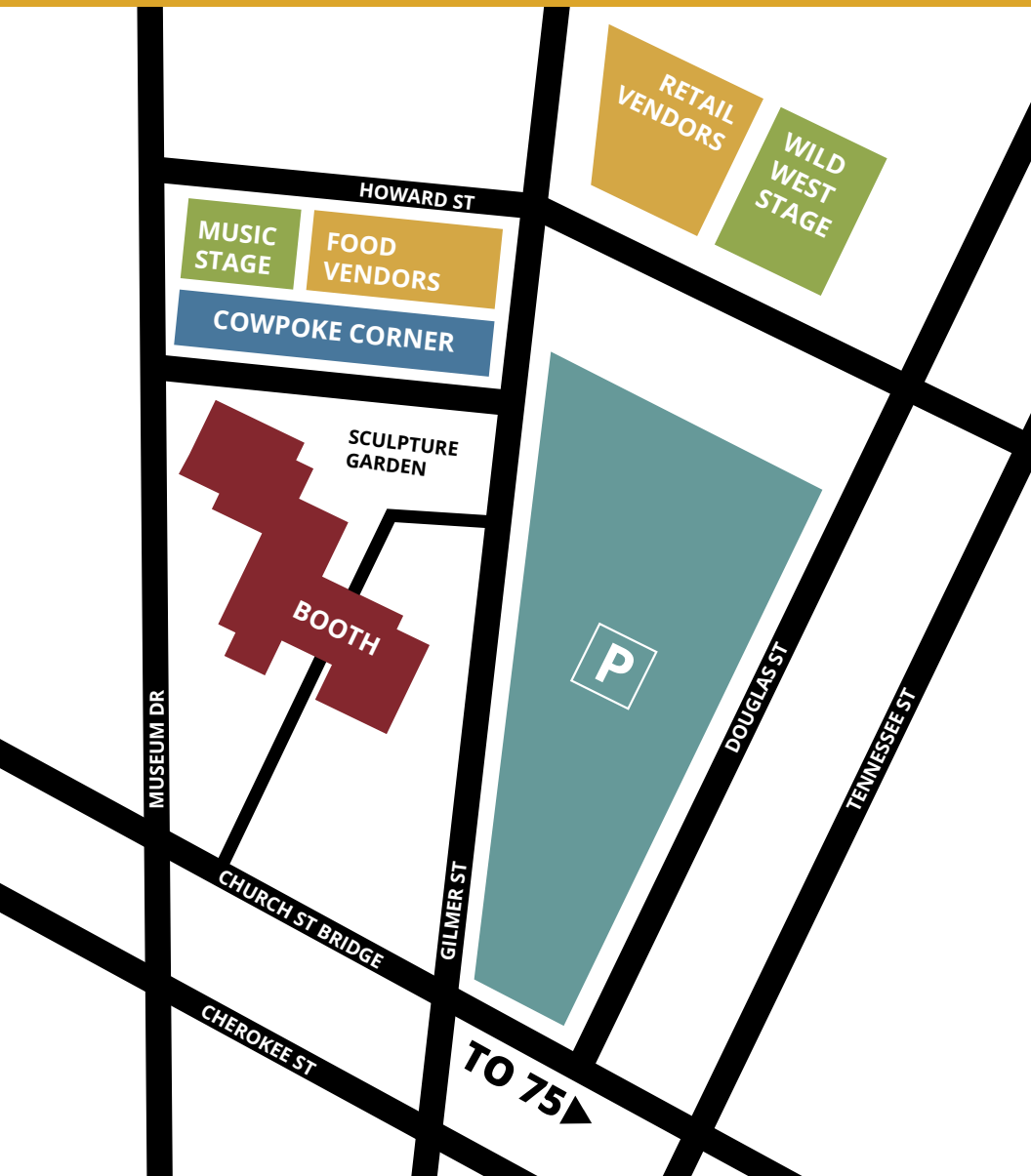
Turn right on Gilmer Street. Museum is three blocks on the left.

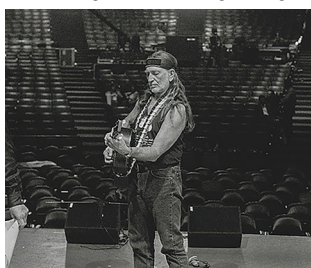

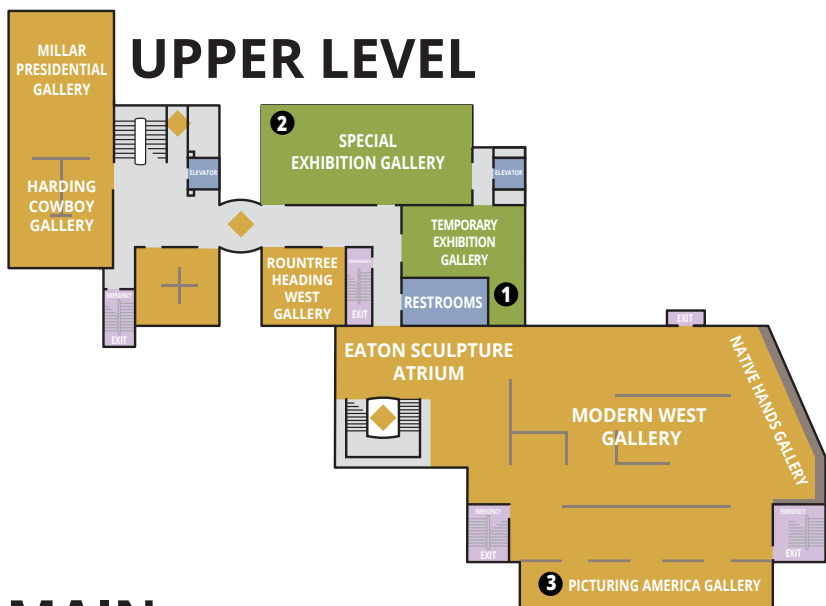

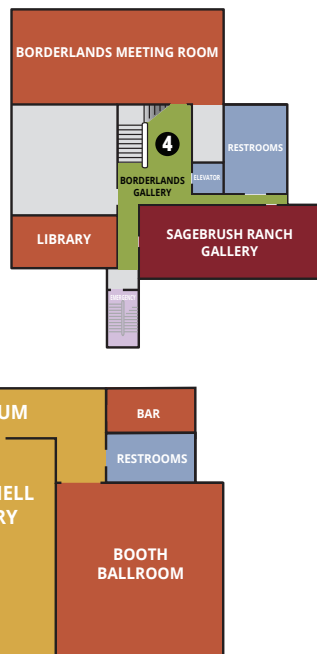
