

Live and Silent Auction Proxy bidding

Booth Western Art Museum is pleased to offer complimentary absentee bidder service as a courtesy to collectors/patrons who cannot attend the auction. Please contact Cathy Lee Eckert at cleckert@georgiamuseums.org or 770-387-2387 to get full details, obtain a bid form, and make arrangements to bid. Bids must be submitted by 12:00pm ET on Thursday, February 16. Below are some of the terms for proxy bidding.

- 1. By placing proxy bid(s), I authorize Booth and its agents to bid on my behalf and try to purchase artwork or item(s) for the lowest possible price. I understand that Booth will bid starting at the minimum amount and increase as necessary in increments up to the maximum amount of my bid.
- 2. Due to the competitive and incremental nature of bidding, I understand a piece may sell for my maximum bid amount and I may not be the winning bidder. If identical proxy bids are submitted, Booth will give precedence to the first one received.
- 3. Proxy bidders will be contacted with auction results by email within 3 business days following the auction.
- 4. I agree that, if my bid is successful, my credit card will be immediately charged the full amount plus any applicable local and Georgia state taxes, which may not apply for shipping out of state.
- 5. If packing, shipping, and shipping insurance are required, Booth will contact me with options. I agree I will be responsible to promptly choose an option and pay those charges.

2023 ARTISTS OF EXCELLENCE JOHN & TERRI MOYERS



John Moyers was born in Atlanta while his father Bill worked here as an illustrator. Soon after, the family moved to New Mexico where John grew up. Bill was an early member of the Cowboy Artists of America (CAA) and won several awards. Surrounded by his father's art, John was naturally aware of art and both the joys and the challenges that face artists trying to make a living. Following art school, he went to the Okanagan Game Farm in Penticton, British Columbia, in 1979 to study wildlife and paint from real life. He also met his wife Terri there. J ohn enjoys painting a wide variety of subjects, American Indians, landscapes, cowboys, and themes from Old Mexico. During his roughly 15 years in the CAA, he won 26 medals for his work at their annual show, including six Best of Show awards. He has also won major awards at many other important events.

Terri Moyers says she never considered any career other than being an artist. Brief formal art training at Alberta College of Art was overshadowed by many trips to the Okanagan Game Farm to paint from life. There, she and artists from all over North America received instruction and critiques from master artists Robert Lougheed and Clarence Tillenius. She considers herself lucky to have studied with Bob Kuhn, Kenneth Riley, Howard Terpning, Ned Jacob, and Bill Moyers, her father-in-law. Terri has won many major awards, most notably the 2012 Prix de West, capturing the highest honor in the genre. She is only the second woman to have received this honor. But, for her, it's about emotions, not the awards. "I put things down I think are beautiful and that move me. I want to share what I see with other people and help them have the same emotion," Terri stated. John and Terri still take annual trips to Canada to paint and regularly undertake painting expeditions all around the West, including Hawaii.



Groves spent ten years as an art director for two large companies, while continuing to study and hone his fine art skills. A two-year mentorship with master painter Jay Moore led him to pursue fine art full time.

GORDON SNIDOW



HIS FAVORITE

Upon his 1959 graduation from art school, **Gordon Snidow** decided to ignore the opportunities of a career in commercial art and follow his dream of painting the West. At the time, there was almost no market for realism, let alone Western Art, and even less for scenes of the Contemporary West. For over 60 years, he has painted the Contemporary American West as it is, unvarnished. During the years that he was in the CAA, he won 24 Gold and Silver Medals and three Best of Show awards.



His murals depicting all of the U.S. Presidents are on view in the Booth's Commanders in Chief Gallery. A 2019 trip out West with Booth Director Seth Hopkins launched a new direction in his artwork and this painting inspired by Arizona's Antelope Canyon is one of the results.



His acrylic paintings are done in a series of small brush strokes that repeat like the words of a traditional Navajo blessing prayer. Images harken back to heartfelt childhood memories and depict the constant struggle for balance between humankind and the Earth.



Artist, title, and price of each piece will be located on a label beside the piece. Pick your favorite piece(s) and place your "Intent to Purchase" slip in the box located beside the piece. If your name is drawn, you win the opportunity to buy the piece.

Each person purchasing a ticket for Boots N' Saddles can pick up "Intent to Purchase" slips at the event entrance. **Only one slip per person for each piece is allowed**. The person whose name is drawn first and posted will have 15 minutes to reach the volunteer located near the piece to pick up the bill of sale to purchase the art. Once the sale is confirmed, the volunteer will write SOLD on the sign. If the first individual drawn has not claimed the work after the initial 15 minutes expire, their name will be crossed off and the second name becomes eligible to purchase the art for the next 15 minutes. If the second individual drawn has not claimed the work after the second 15 minute period, their name will be crossed off and the unsold art will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

- 8:00 pm Two names will be drawn and written on the label beside each piece.
- 8:00 pm First name drawn has 15 minutes to purchase the work.
- 8:15 pm The second name drawn will have 15 minutes to purchase the work, if it remains unsold.
- 8:30 pm All unsold artwork becomes available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Payment in full must be completed the night of the sale. You may claim your artwork upon payment and take it with you or arrange for shipping. All fees incurred for packing and shipping are the responsibility of the purchaser. All sales are final. State sales tax applies on all purchases not shipped out of state.
