A docent, which is a Museum tour guide or educator, will each be assigned one of our groups.

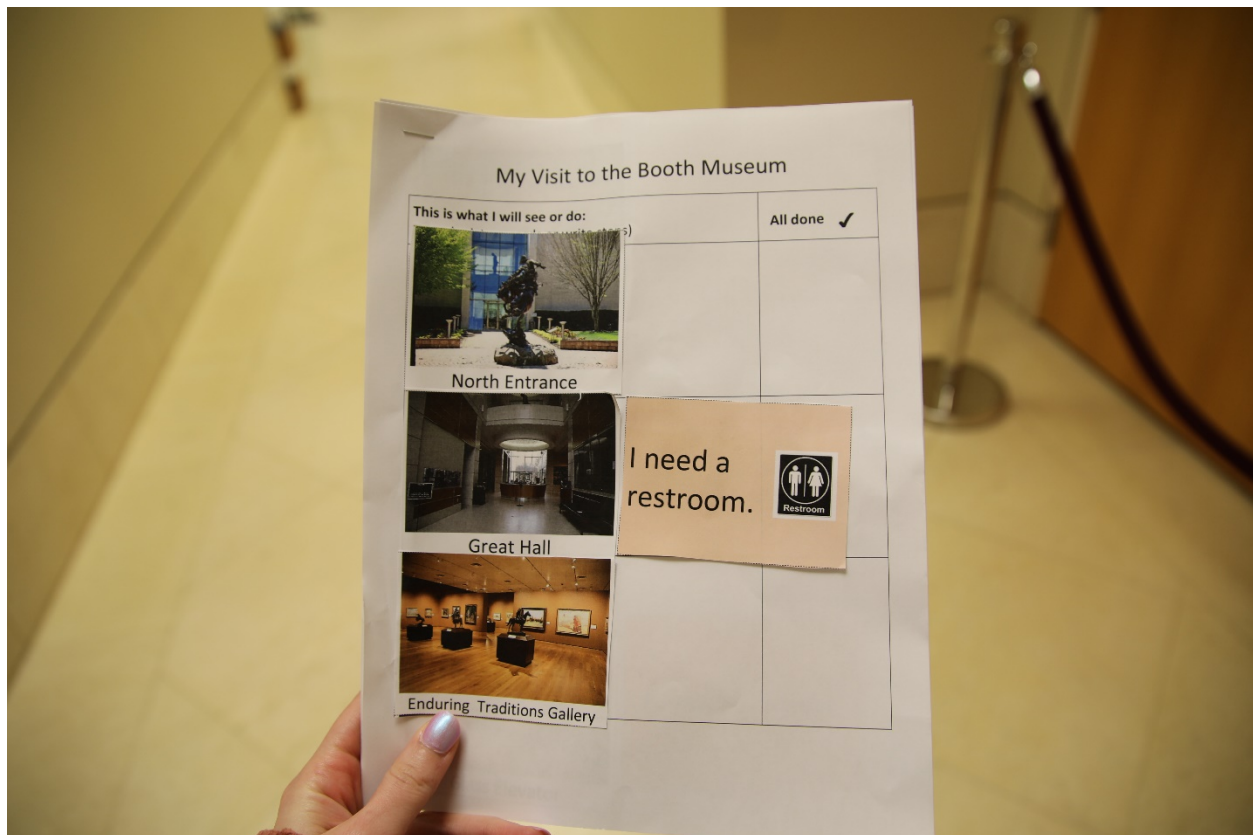




During our program, we will go to 5 or 6 places in the Museum. We will be at each place for 15-20 minutes. Our docent will let us know when it is time to go to the next place.
