4. You can also use other picture cards to say when you need to take a break, sit down, use the restroom, etc.
5. Bring your completed tour checklist with you to the Museum.
6. Print out a blank checklist and extra cards in case you want to change your checklist while you are at the Museum.
7. When you are at the Museum and have completed a stop on your tour, check it off with a pencil in the "All Done" column.

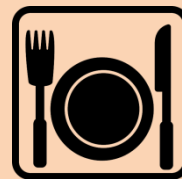
