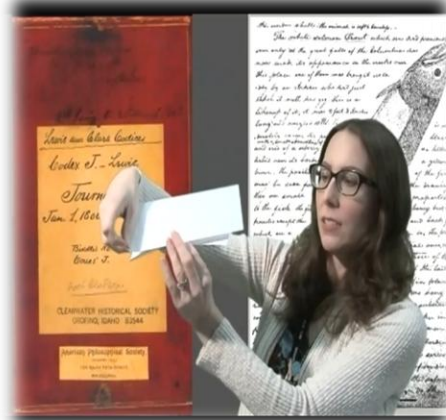

Grades 2-12, bring your students back in time with **Passport to the West!** Learn about Indigenous cultures through a visit to Nêhiyawak (Cree) and Cherokee encampments; attend Indigenous dance and cultural performances representing a variety nations; horse & rodeo traditions of Mexico and Atlanta Black Rodeo; UWG Anthropology hosts pottery making, gorget making and more! Students will be able to roam around the festival grounds (with a chaperone of course) and learn about the West, experience chuck wagons, artists, pioneer life with Bartow History Museum, Tellus Science Museum station and more! **This is an ONSITE, OUTDOOR event (with a rain plan). Cost: \$9 per student; \$16 parents; teachers, drivers are free; event eligible for transportation reimbursement- public school buses only; minimum required**
